










World Wide Treasures 3 - Crossroads

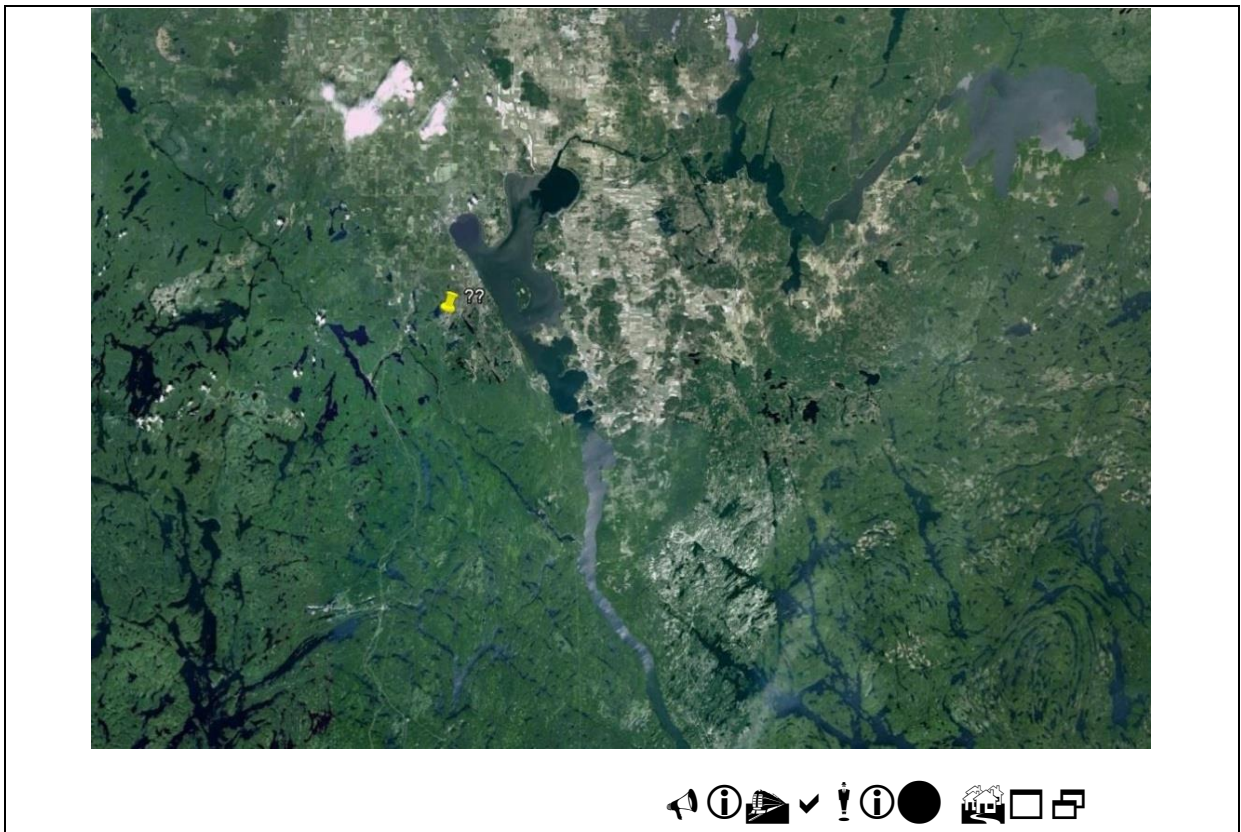
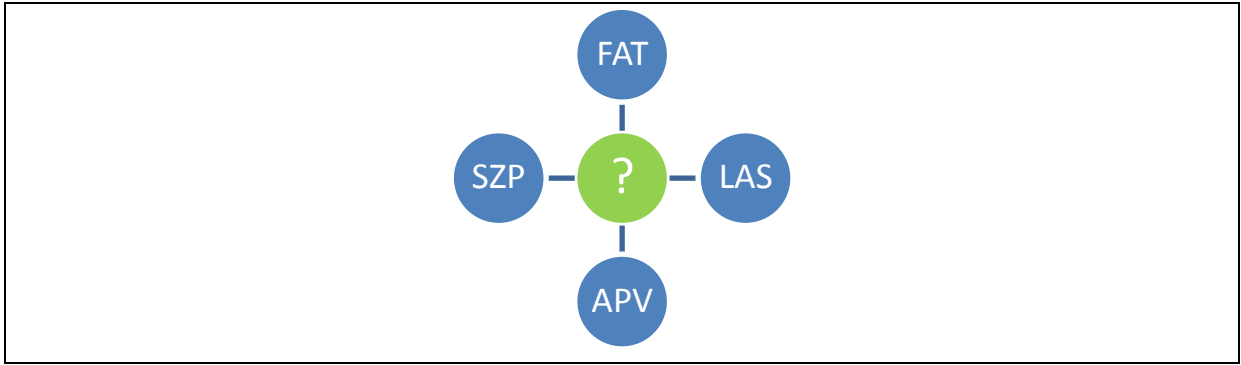


After a short flight from Copenhagen to Munich, Martin picked up his rental car and went to collect the next treasure. What would it be this time, he wondered? More clues? More travelling?
